

Language Arts

This month students are working hard on **Read to Self**, **Read to Someone**, **Guided Reading** (with their teacher), **Shared Reading** of theme stories (Stories and Poems in our Reading Treasure) and **Work on Writing** with journal entries!

One of the areas that we are discussing as a class is the concept of "Where do we get our writing ideas from?" We assist children in exploring this concept by reading a variety of different genres (fiction, non-fiction, poetry, how-to, joke books etc.). This helps children to understand where writers get their ideas.

Word Families:

Word Work continues to be a focus during the month of November. This month in addition to continuing to work on letters of the alphabet and the sounds that they make, we are introducing more activities around Word Families. These activities reinforce your child's knowledge of consonant sounds, recognition of beginning and end sounds that transfers to writing in their journals. Imagine using the word **big.** Students are asked to make the word **dig**, they are listening to the beginning sound and then creating the new word! This assists the child's move toward independent writing as they expand their vocabulary. Home Reading:

We are so excited to have introduced our children to their weekly School Wide Book Buddy and to our online Book Buddy with Raz-Kids.

Remember that inside the Book Buddy you can find tips for reading with your child, and how to help your child with the reading process. More tips can be found on the École Edwards website.

Successful readers read with their parents and repeat the story several times over a few days. Creating a successful reader takes patience and repetition. One good tip is to discuss what they THINK is happening in the story by doing a picture walk (looking at and discussing the pictures) before reading.

Please remember that we do our best to ensure that the books are exchanged twice a week, Monday or Thursday, depending when the books are returned, however, there are times that our day is so busy that we don't have a chance to do a book exchange. We appreciate your understanding and patience with this!

Mathematics



Students have been busy learning about numbers and patterns. For a fun bonding activity look around your house and community for patterns. What kinds of patterns can you find? Can your child label the patterns that you find together?

Did you know that your child is learning to represent number through a variety of activities? Ten frames and dot cards are assisting your child in

recognizing visual representations of numbers automatically. In addition, your child is learning to build numbers that are 1 more, 1 less, 2 more and 2 less than given numbers up to 20.

Your child can use a ten frame and manipulatives (blocks, bingo chips, etc) to help build given numbers.


Example of a ten frame:

Science



We are discussing and observing the seasonal changes for Fall that happen around us. We focus on the changes as they relate to plants, weather, animals and people.

In addition, our unit on "**Colours**" continues for the month of November. We have been learning a great deal about colours – for example how to create secondary colours by mixing the primary colours, what happens to colours when black or white is added to primary and secondary colours. We will also discuss the terms opaque and transparent.



Physical Education



Our focus for this month will be goal oriented skills and cooperative play. Our secondary focus will be ball skills.

November will bring ways of exploring Art through use of paper and paint mediums.



In Health, we are continuing to incorporating author Michele Borba's **Building Moral Intelligence** along with the school wide focus on **The Leader in Me** and **The 8 Habits of Happy Kids**.

Our focus is to learn about conscience: knowing the difference between right and wrong. Students will have the opportunity to learn, discuss and explore conscience through books, video clips, a song and class discussions. We will relate conscience to the Disney character Pinocchio. Pinocchio's conscience is Jiminy Cricket.


