## It's that time of year when students are getting sick at school

Please review AHS's recommendations for a safe return to school after illness:

• **Respiratory Illness:** Stay home until all symptoms have improved, feeling well enough to resume normal activities, and be fever-free for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medications.

• Gastrointestinal Illness: Stay home until 48 hours after all symptoms have resolved.

• **Rash Illness:** Stay home for the length of time recommended by the AHS Public Health Outbreak Team. How long to stay home depends on the cause of the rash.

Please make sure your contact information is up to date, including an emergency contact in case we need to call you for a pick-up if your child is sick at school.

**School Goal:** Students are happy, healthy, feel they belong and are safe, and experience success in learning environments that are inclusive of every learner.


## HOW CAN YOU HELP?
