# School Population – Quick Facts

- 693 students, 29 classrooms K-5
- 27 teachers, 13 support staff
- 98 students or 14% are identified with specialized or exceptional needs (IPPs/PLPs)
- 35 students or 5% are English Language Learners
- 47 students or 7% self-declare as First Nations, Inuit or Metis

# **Highlights:**

- Terry Fox Run and donations were outstanding! The school raised over \$7000 in donations, wow! To celebrate achieving our school goal 1) Mme Berlin cut her long hair! 2) classes created a fun theme day 3) all grade 1-5 students had a whole school extra recess with 10 parent/ grandparent volunteers, and 4) administration donated an extra \$500 for the school goal was \$5000.
- Truth & Reconciliation Week and Orange Shirt Day was reflective and powerful for learning about Canada's Indigenous history and unfortunate legacy of residential schools, as well as learning how to move forward in a united way towards peace and acceptance with the belief that #everychildmatters.
- **SOCKTOBER!** During the entire month of October, we collect socks for those in need. Last year we collected 1500 pairs of socks, and we hope to match or surpass this achievement this year. Bring in socks!
- Quest Theatre was a blast! Students enjoyed a theatre performance outside on October 5<sup>th</sup> with their classes called "Hello Friend" and learning about friendship and kindness in the performance.
- Stampeders visit on October 24th for École Edwards Football Day! It was a huge hit!

# School Goals & Continuous Improvement – Updates

**Action Items:** Continue collecting assessment data and feedback from staff, students, parents; finalize this year's school goals and professional learning plan

# Fall Assessment Results for Literacy and Numeracy Strengths:

- 85 students or 42% of 199 grade 4 and 5 students are reading at or above grade level in <u>English</u>
- 29 students or 24% of 116 grade 4 and 5 students are reading at or above grade level in <u>French</u>
- 24 students or 21% of 113 grade 4 students are performing mathematics at or above grade level
- 16 students or 13% of 122 grade 5 students are performing mathematics at or above grade level

# **Areas for Growth:**

- 57% of grade 4 and 5 students are reading at approaching (8%) or below (49%) grade level in English
- 76% of grade 4 and 5 students are reading at approaching (4%) or below (71%) grade level in <u>French</u>
- 79% of grade 4 students are performing mathematics at approaching (39%) or below grade level (40%)
- 87% of grade 5 students are performing mathematics are approaching (42%) or below grade level (45%)
