# School Population – Quick Facts

- 707 students, 29 classrooms K-5
- 27 teachers, 13 support staff
- 107 students or 14% are identified with specialized or exceptional needs (IPPs/PLPs)
- 35 students or 5% are English Language Learners
- 47 students or 7% self-declare as First Nations, Inuit or Metis
- Students in English programming: 333
- Students in French Immersion programming: 374
