6. Edwards has amazing parents who volunteer in so many ways – over 100 volunteers were invited last year to our Volunteer Appreciation Tea.


5. Every classroom this year has our School Mission and Vision hung up, along with our school-wide PBIS expectation posters.

SCHOOL-WIDE EXPECTATIONS

PBIS is our system for encouraging students to be successful as learners and leaders. for PBIS stands Positive Behaviour Interventions and Supports. Essentially we have 4 school rules that we call expectations:

- We Belong/ Nous Appartenons
- We Care / Nous Sommes Attentionnes
- We are Independent/ Nous Sommes Indépendants
- We Do Our Best/ Nous Faison de Notre Mieux

Students are taught the expectations through explicit teaching and modelling. By practicing the expectations they thrive as learners and leaders, helping to make the school a safe, caring, and supportive place to be.

We encourage families to try having these rules or expectations at home, as well. We use them for solving problems, talking through misunderstandings when there is an argument, or celebrating efforts made.







SCHOOL EDUCATION PLAN UPDATE

SUPERINTENDENT UPDATE FOR FAMILIES

As we begin the school year, I wanted to address an important topic to us all – school and family communication.

At RVS we work hard to share information about what is happening in your child's classroom, at the school, and across the division. This communication comes in many forms – classroom emails, parent/teacher conferences, school newsletters, websites, social media, division letters, and more. RVS teachers, school, and division staff aim to provide you with the most relevant information. We encourage you to please take time to read it. Our school and division websites are a great resource for additional information and to answer questions you may have – please check them often for updates.

There are times when you may need more specific information about your child, which could be in an email, phone call, or meeting depending on the question or situation. We welcome ongoing dialogue with families.

We ask for your patience and understanding in how and when a teacher or administrator responds. Most of their days are spent in front of students focused on their learning. When they are not in the classroom, they are preparing for the next day, reviewing assignments, or getting home to their families and they might not be able to return your call or email that day. Under normal circumstances, school staff will respond to emails within 24 hours on school days (not after 6 p.m.) or by the end of the following workday if received on the weekend/holiday. Across all of RVS, we do not expect school staff/teachers to read or respond to emails after 6 p.m. on school days or on weekends/holidays. This common expectation is across all our schools and is described in Administrative Procedure <u>145</u> which can be found on our website.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding. Together, we can create a supportive environment that benefits our students' learning and growth.
