School Population – Quick Facts

- 698 students, 29 classrooms K-5
- 27 teachers, 13 support staff
- 100 students or 14% are identified with specialized or exceptional needs (IPPs/PLPs)
- 35 students or 5% are English Language Learners
- 47 students or 7% self-declare as First Nations, Inuit or Metis
- Students in English programming: 330
- Students in French Immersion programming: 368

Highlights:

- Remembrance Day Ceremony on November 10th was a success with 2 groups 10:30am and 1:30pm – parents and families attended the wonderful event which included student MCs, bilingual programming, and student performances
- Métis Awareness Week as a blast Nov. 15-18th
 - Métis singer, artist and knowledge keeper

- Parent Coffee Principal Chats started monthly in October time to connect, ask questions, give feedback. There was one on Nov. 16th 9:30-10:00am
- House Teams Kick Off Assemblies on Nov. 24 and 25th
 - Students will be introduced to their house teams and are encouraged to wear their team colours!
 - Special activities are planned for each month as House Teams Days – wear your colour
- **We started Student Morning Announcements** on our Intercom System, to help celebrate each day. Different student leaders come each day to help with announcements in both French and English with Mme Hooper and Ms. Prud'Homme.
- We are designing supervision, lunch options, and small groups to support multiple students throughout the day, at recess, and during lunch eating times. We also tried eating in the gym as a large group last week to give teachers an extra break ©

School Goals & Continuous Improvement – Updates

On-going work to build success in learning across the school.

- Increase of small groups for learning supports in literacy, numeracy, emotional regulation, and French Immersion learning

- Available funding for additional resources and supports for the new curriculum and for Learning Disruption Funding, similar to what was in place last year.
- Increase of student leadership opportunities in school announcements, events, and learning buddy classrooms across the school.
