School Council Minutes

Ecole Edwards Elementary School Airdrie, Alberta

First council meeting of the 2023/2024 school year. Held in person at the school and available via Zoom. Video can be found on the Ecole Edwards School Council Facebook page.

Welcome - Heidi Vigna (Chair): Started meeting at 6:30pm, in person and on Zoom. Approximately 7 parents and 3 teachers in attendance.

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Treasurer's Report:

- Approved recess equipment
- Special guest activities
- Revenue from family dance
- Community outreach(\$100 per class, 16 classes)
- Fun lunches May and June
- Commitments
 - Fun day and popsicles, June: remove popsicle price, as they were bought with donated gift cards; remove water bottles price, as they were carried over from family dance; remove special guest price, as it was already accounted for (we had a gift to pay for special guest from RVS)
 - A motion was made by Amanda to make the necessary changes from the committed Fun Day funds, to the actual spent Fun Day funds.
 Melanie seconded the motion and it was passed with no objections.
 - Welcome Back BBQ, Sept: actual expense \$235.51, committed expense \$600.
 - A motion was made by Melanie to make the necessary changes from the committed BBQ funds, to the actual spent BBQ funds. Jacelyn seconded the motion and it was passed with no objections.
- Total funds available = \$3456.49 (without changes made tonight)
- Student care (used for any students or families who cannot afford items when needed clothing, food, field trip funds, etc): 2 new parents taking the lead on this; they will coordinate with our office staff.

- \$1881.35 for student care fund by donation only.
 - Melanie advised there is a bylaw for the student fund: once the fund gets to \$1500, it should be taken off School Cash Online. If we want to change it, we must amend the bylaw.
- Any school donations over \$25 get a receipt.
- Erin, on Zoom, advised that her company, Burton's Buttons, can donate clothing to school for Student Care Program. Erin will be in contact with the volunteers in charge of Student Care.




